

GETTING TO KNOW 7150 DVR SET-TOP BOX (STB):



1) Network Ethernet Port – If your router and Set-Top Box are close enough to each other you can run an Ethernet cable from the router to this port for a hardwired connection.

2) <u>Component Input</u> – These ports are for your Component Video Cable.

3) <u>Video Input</u> – This port is used to connect the video/audio input, the yellow, white and red connectors found on the Composite Video Cable.





4) Optical Audio Input (optional) – This port is for Optical Audio Cables (options not available on all Televisions).

5) <u>HDMI Video Input</u> – This port is used to connect a HDMI Video Cable.

6) Power – Used for the power supply to the unit.


Setting Up Your 7150 DVR Set-Top Box with Ethernet and to Your Television:

1) Your router should be setup close enough to connect the Ethernet cable from the LAN port (one of the four Yellow Ports on the back as shown below) to the Network port shown in Figure: 1.



- 2) Next you will want to connect your video cable from your Set-Top Box to your television using one of the examples found in Figures 2, 3 and 5. Connecting those to their corresponding inputs.
- 3) Lastly you will connect your power Supply to the power as found in Figure 6

Once you have these all setup, you can power up your Television and Set-Top Box. You will want to make sure you Television is set to the input that you have connected from the Set-Top Box to the Television. The Television Input List will vary between brands and models. Basically, you are looking to match this up with the connection have just setup. You should now be able to view your television programming.
